

# **BOOK READING: ROSIE** THE RIVETERS OF IOWA **BY LINDA BETSINGER MCCANN**

Rosie the Riveter was a name used to encourage women to work during WWII to take the place of the men who were fighting the war. Iowa had 70 businesses

that used women to meet production of military needs. Linda Betsinger McCann, author, was able to speak with 35 women who had worked as Rosie's. Some worked in Iowa and others went to the



West Coast. Books are available for purchase, cash or check only.

McCann is an author of non-fiction lowa history; including Prisoners of War in Iowa; Prohibition in Iowa; several books about the Civilian Conservation Corps in different areas of lowa; and The Vanished Towns of the Cedar Valley series.




